Help Your IOC Members Improve Anti-Doping

iNADO urges all NADOs and RADOs to contact their country's IOC Members before the end of the September with constructive proposals for anti-doping reform.

IOC President Thomas Bach has this weekend asked International Olympic Committee Members to provide their views to the IOC on how anti-doping can be improved: <http://www.insidethegames.biz/articles/1041735/exclusive-bach-calls-on-ioc-membership-to-suggest-ways-to-reform-anti-doping-system>. Proposals for improvement will be discussed at the "IOC Summit" on October 8, 2016.

Prior to that meeting, it is vital that NADOs and RADOs contact and assist their IOC Members understand the issues and make constructive proposals for improvement. iNADO urges NADOs and RADOs to review with their IOC Members the "reform agenda" produced by the Copenhagen meeting of NADO leaders (http://www.inado.org/fileadmin/user_upload/Special_NADO_Summit_Reform_Proposals.pdf), and press their IOC Members to promote that reform agenda at the "IOC Summit."

This "Olympic Summit" will be a key opportunity to encourage the IOC to pursue its goal of more independence for anti-doping for international sport, but in a way that builds on the existing network of independent NADOs to do the job, and in a way that reforms international sport organisation governance to increase confidence in clean sport. This includes increasing support for WADA as anti-doping's global regulator, and enhancing its independent investigative capacity.

Please do not miss this opportunity to support you country's IOC Members and educate them on a way forward that will strengthen anti-doping and enhance the IOC's role as a champion of clean sport.
