

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CHAPTER



INTRODUCTION

The National Anti Doping Agency (NADA) is an Autonomous Body set up by the Government of India in the year 2005 as a Society registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860. NADA has become fully operational during this year.

The management and affairs of NADA vests with the Governing Body headed by Hon'ble Minister, Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports as Chairman, Secretary (Sports) as Vice-Chairman with six Members and a Member Secretary. The Chairman presides over the meeting of the Society and exercise the general supervision over its functioning. Vice-Chairman shall preside over the meting of the Governing Body in the absence of Chairman and carry out the functions assigned to him/her by the Chairman. The Director General, NADA is the Member Secretary of the Governing Body and represents NADA in all the official dealings. He shall be responsible for the activities of the Society and be the authorized signatory on any document related to the NADA.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The aims and objectives of NADA are given as under:-

- i) To act as a nodal agency for implementation of anti doping programmes in the area of sport in the country within the policy framework of the Government.
- ii) To function as advisory body to the Government on policy formulation, development of schemes and programmes and strategy and methodology of programme implementation related to anti doping in the country.
- iii) To undertake, promote and support quality research, documentation and publication related to anti doping measures and programmes.
- iv) To undertake, promote and support all activities (including publication of charts, illustration, journals, news bulletins, audio visuals, organizing plays, making documentaries, conducting seminars/training/workshops for all stakeholders etc.) related to dissemination of information about anti doping programmes and educating the athletes, coaches, other supporting personnel and federations about the harmful effects of the prohibited performance enhancing substances and methods.

- v) To undertake, promote and support awareness programme on anti doping for civil society.
- vi) To develop and standardize rules, procedures and methods for anti doping programmes at par with latest international standards and quality management system for sample collection, test planning and result management.
- vii) To set up institutional mechanism and procedures of initial review, follow up investigation provisional hearings and notification as well as procedures for presentation of cases before Disciplinary and Appeal panels set up by the Government for cases related to adverse analytica findings.
- viii) To conduct workshop/training programmes for sample collection and result management based or the latest internationally recognized and accepted practices and systems.
- ix) To coordinate and cooperate with other relevant international and national organizations, bodies/groups working on or associated with anticoping programmes and activities.
- x) To encourage reciprocal testing with National Anti Doping Organizations of other countries.
- xi) To conduct in competition and out of competition dope tests on sportspersons.
- xii) To undertake consultancy and other activities related to anti doping measures and programmes or demand from sports federations, international organizations, civil society and private sector.
- xiii) To perform or do all such other lawful acts and things as may be necessary, incidental or conducive to the attainment and furtherance of all or any other objects of the Society.
- xiv) To take all necessary steps for harmonization of anti doping programmes as per the latest WADA code and guidelines.
- xv) To undertake any other activities related to anti doping programmes assigned by the Government from time to time.
- xvi) The income of the Society howsoever derived, shall be applied towards the promotion of the objects set forth subject to such conditions as the Government of India may, from time to time, impose.
- xvii) To raise or acquire funds or property from Central/State Government, Non Governmental agencies, Charitable Trusts, by way of donations, grants, contributions or by taking loan from public or private financial institutions. The funds, properties, assets and all other resources, present and future of the organization shall be utilized for any or all the purposes or objectives of the Society as stated above and also for all its activities.

OBJECTIVES INCIDENTAL TO THE MAIN OBJECTIVES

- i) To accept or collect funds through sponsorships, grants, donations, subscription, subsidy, aid etc. either in cash or cheque or in kind for furtherance of the aims and objectives of the Society.
- ii) To acquire, hold, manage, hire, mortgage, lease, transfer, sell or dispose off part or all properties (moveable or immovable).
- iii) To facilitate, associate or cooperate with any other society or association having same and/ or similar

objectives and aims in such manner and to such extent as may be desired or possible.

iv) All the income, earnings, moveable and immoveable properties of the Society shall be solely utilized and applied towards its aims and objectives only as set forth and no profit and surplus thereof shall be paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of dividends, bonus, profits or any other manner whatsoever to the present or past members of the Society or to any person claiming through anyone or more present and past members of the Society. No member of the Society shall have any personal claim on any moveable and immoveable properties of the Society or make any profit whatsoever by virtue of his membership.

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
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ORGANIZATION SET-UP

NATIONAL ANTI DOPING AGENCY-RULES

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On 7th March, 2008, the National Anti Doping Agency (NADA) has accepted the World Anti)ope Doping Code. These Anti Doping Rules were adopted and implemented in conformity with the NADA's lore, responsibilities under the Code and were in furtherance of NADA's continuing efforts to eradicate doping in onof sport in India. s all

In pursuance of the decision of the World Anti Doping Agency (WADA) to make amendments to the 2. WADA Code in 2009, the Government of India, Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports notified the amended t-III, National Anti Doping Agency Rules laying down the conditions for Athletes and Athlete support personnel for participation in sports events, as also the manner of collection of samples, conduct of results management of dope test results and conduct of disciplinary and appeal proceedings at national level. The amended rules will apply to whole of India and have come into operation with effect from 1st January, 2010.

NADA, as an entity designated by Government as possessing the primary authority to adopt and 3. implement Anti Doping Rules, directs the collection of samples, the management of test results and the conduct of hearings all at the national level. Further, it may not be out of place to mention that Anti Doping programmes seek to preserve what is intrinsically valuable about sport. This intrinsic value is often referred to as 'the spirit of sport'. The spirit of sports is the celebration of the human spirit, body and mind and is characterized by the values such as ethics, fair play and honesty; health; excellence in performance, character and education.

4 While NADA will strive to discourage and prevent Indian Athletes and supporting personnel from using illegal and artificial performance enhancing prohibited drugs and to promote a healthy life style among our athletes, in its endeavour to request all stake holders also to join hands with NADA in completely eradicating the evil of doping in sport in India.

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SAMPLE TESTING

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NADA is responsible to implement effective number of In-Competition and Out of Competition tests on the athletes in its registered testing pool. The registered testing pool includes international and national athletes being tested by NADA relating to all disciplines of sport. Based on the data available in the registered testing pool NADA develops a test distribution plan and allocates the number of samples for each sport or disciplines required for effective anti doping action plan. This plan includes both Out of Competition testing and In Competition testing of both urine and blood.

In-Competition testing

All National level in competition testing is the responsibility of NADA and the selection of athletes for sample testing is pre determined based on the regulations of the relevant international federations of event ruling body. Athletes are notified of their selection for testing immediately following competition and sample collection is done in accordance with the international standard for testing.

Out-of-Competition testing

Out of Competition testing or any testing done outside of an event and NADA ensures that all the testing included in the registered testing pool could be tested at any time at any place. For this purpose, the the the registered testing pool are required to provide accurate and correct whereabouts nformation on periodical basis. Whereabouts information includes details of athlete address, work chedule, training venues etc. Failure to provide such information may be considered as anti doping rule iolation leading to a sanction.

Festing of Core Probables for CWG 2010

India being the host country for the conduct of Commonwealth Games, Delhi 2010, NADA was tiven additional responsibility of testing of all core probables shortlisted for participation in the CWG 2010. ADA has conducted periodical sample testing of the athletes at various camps.



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RESULT MANAGEMENT

During the Results Management Process, the following procedure is followed by NADA

Upon receipt of an Analytical Findings for A sample from the laboratory (without bearing the name of athlete) the name of the athlete is decoded by NADA.

If the A sample proves negative i.e. no Prohibited Substance or Methods detected, the athlete and the concerned National Federation (NF), International Federation (IF) and WADA shall be so informed.

If an Adverse Analytical Findings is reported for A sample, NADA will conduct an Initial Review to determine whether :-

- a. an applicable Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) has been granted or will be granted as provided in the International Standard for TUE.
- b. there is any apparent departure from The International Standard for Testing or International Standard for Laboratories that caused the Adverse Analytical Finding.

If the initial review validates the TUE and procedures for the prohibited substance (s) reported by the laboratory for A Sample, the sample is treated as negative, the athlete and the concerned NF, IF & WADA will be so informed.

If the Initial Review does not validate the Adverse Analytical Finding, the athlete is notified about his/her Adverse Analytical Finding of 'A' Sample. The concerned NF, IF and WADA are also notified.

If the Adverse Analytical Findings for A sample is for a Prohibited Substance that is not a specified substance, NADA shall provisionally suspend the athlete pending the hearing panel.

An athlete has the right to request for the analysis of his/her B Sample within seven (7) working days of receiving the notice concerning Adverse Analytical Finding of his/her A Sample.

If the athlete requests for 'B' Sample Analysis, NADA contacts the laboratory to schedule time and date and notifies the athlete of the 'B' Sample Analysis.

If there is no request by the athlete to witness his/her 'B' Sample, NADA informs the laboratory to

conduct the 'B' sample Analysis in the presence of an Independent Observer.

- 10. If the 'B' sample Analysis by the laboratory proves negative, the entire test will be conside negative and the athlete, NF, (IF) and WADA shall be so informed.
- 11. If the 'B' Sample Analysis confirms that 'A' Sample Adverse Analytical Finding, a Second Norwill be served by NADA to the athlete alongwith a copy to the concerned parties i.e. NF, IF & WA asserting the Anti Doping Rule Violation. The Anti Doping Disciplinary Panel will be also notif alongwith all documents relevant to the assertion, for disciplinary proceedings to be conducted in positive case as per the WADA compliant Anti Doping Rules of NADA.
- 12. The athlete will be advised to present his/her case before the Anti Doping Disciplinary panel on date & time fixed by the panel for hearing.
 - 13. During the hearing process, the athlete is given an opportunity to be represented by Counsel : interpreter (at own expense) to establish basis for elimination or reducing the sanctions.
 - 14. The athlete will have the right to appeal against the decision of the Anti Doping Disciplinary Pa by lodging a notice of appeal with the Anti Doping Appeal Panel within 14 days of the decision of Anti Doping Disciplinary Panel.

INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

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

No. 25-5/2DB8/ID.—Consequent upon the establishment of National Anti Doping Ager (NADA), India as a Registered Society in the year 2005 (and as amended in 2008) to be the National Le Apex Body for implementation of the country's Anti-DoprngTrogrammes in Sports, and after obtaining approval of the Governing Body of the Society headed by Union Minister of Youth Affairs and Sports in Meeting held on 25-7-2007, the Government hereby notifies the Bye-laws of the Society which have co into force w.e.f. 7-4-2008.

NATIONAL ANTI-DOPING AGENCY

(SERVICE, ADMINISTRATIVE AND FINANCIAL BYE-LAWS)

GENERAL SCOPE

CHAPTER I

1. Short title and commencement

- (i) These bye-laws shall be called the National Anti Doping Agency (Service Administrative a Financial) Bye-laws, 2008.
- (ii) These shall be deemed to have come into force with effect from 7-4-2008. No one will affected as a result of 'retrospective effect' being given to this order.

2. Application

(i) These Bye-laws shall apply to all employees of the Society.

3. Definitions

- (i) In these Bye-laws, unless the context otherwise required :---
 - (a) "Society" wherever occurring in the Bye-laws means the National Anti Dopi Agency (NADA),
 - (b) "Appointing Authority" in relation to any post under the Society, means the author competent to make appointments to that post under bye-law 5,
 - (c) "Deputationist" means an employee of any other organization whose services a obtained by the Society on deputation terms,
 - (d) "Employee" means a person serving the Society in any specified posts mentioned Schedule-II,
 - (e) "Pay" means the pay as defined in the fundamental Rules from time to time,
 - (f) "Recruitment Rules" means the recruitment rules of the Society,
 - (g) "Sanctioning Authority" means the authorities specified in Schedule-I,

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(h) "Selection Committee" means Committees appointed with the approval of Governal

Body for selection of persons for appointment to posts specified in Schedule-II,

- (i) "Governing Body" means the Governing Body of the National Anti Doping Agency,
- (j) "Chairman/Vice Chairman" means the Chairman/Vice Chairman of the Governing Body of NADA,

"Chief Executive Officer (CEO)" means the CEO of the National Anti Doping Agency.

ADMINISTRATIVE BYE-LAWS

CHAPTER II

GRADES AND CATEGORIES OF POSTS

4. Grades and Categories of posts

(k)

- (i) The posts under the Society shall be of the grades and categories specified in Schedule-II and as revised from time to time by the Governing Body with the approval of Government of India.
- (ii) The pay scales and Groups as are approved for Government servants in General shall be adopted. The regular posts of the Society and their pay scales as on date shall be as in the Schedule-II. Any modification shall be with the final approval of the Government.
- (iii) Governing Body can create new posts or abolish existing posts in the functional interest of the Society subject to the approval of the Government.

CHAPTER III

RECRUITMENT

5. Appointing authorities

Appointment to posts under the society shall be made by authorities specified' in Schedule-I.

Dopi 6. Methods of Recruitment

- I. by promotion;
- II. by direct recruitment;

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III. by deputation;

- IV by re-employment of retired employees of the Society or Central/State Government or any other organization;
- V on contract for a specified period of technical personnel on specific terms and as approved by the Governing Body.

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VI. by Transfer

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- (2) In terms of Rule 3(c) of the Rules of the Society, Director General of National Anti Dopin Agency will be appointed by Government of India. Recruitment to the other posts shall be may by the Director General or any other officer delegated by him and as given in the Recruitme rules. In doing so, the Appointing Authority shall pay due regard to (i) the provisions of the Employment Exchange (Compulsory Notification of Vacancies) Act, 1959 and (ii) orders for reservation in services for Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes, other Backward Class, E servicemen, differently abled and any other categories, as may be notified by the Government India from time to time, and (iii) in any other manner, as may be decided by Governing Body individual cases, having special regard to the situation or requirement.
- (3) Where any relaxation is necessary the same shall be as per the procedure and authority specific in the notification to the Recruitment Rules. Where additional posts for any isolated work or casual nature are needed, the CEO/DG can out source as per provisions of GFR in this regard.
- 7. Recruitment by Promotion
 - (1) Appointment to a post in any grade by promotion shall be made whether in a substantive of officiating capacity from amongst employees serving in National Anti Doping Agency in post in the next lower grade in line for promotion on the basis of recommendations of a formall constituted Departmental Promotion Committee. In the case of appointments on ad-hoc basis the guidelines contained in DOPT O.M. No. 28036/8-37-Estt. (D), dated 30-3-1988 as amended from time to time shall be strictly adhered to in respect of all categories of posts.
 - (2) Every appointment by promotion to posts under Group 'A' (technical and non-technical PBand PB-3) shall be selection on the basis of merit and due consideration to seniority in the case candidates of equal merit and on the recommendations of the Departmental Promotio Committee.
 - (3) An appointment by promotion to posts in Group 'B', 'C and 'D' will be on seniority-cum-fitnes basis.

8. Direct Recruitment

Save in exceptional circumstances, and subject to Vice-Chairman's approval, appointment to post direct recruitment may be made on the recommendation of a Selection Committee from amongst.

- (i) Candidates recommended by the Employment Exchange on requisition in respect of the categories of employees of which recruitment has to be made through the Employme Exchange and/or
- (ii) From amongst the candidates applying in response to an advertisement, or otherwise.

9. Appointment by Deputation

Appointment may be made on deputation basis with the approval of the relevant Selection Comm^{itte} on such terms and conditions as may be agreed to between the lending authority and the National Ar Doping Agency subject to Government Rules in this regard.

- (1) The service of a temporary employee may be terminated by the Appointing Authority assigning any reason at any time during the period of probation.
- (2) The service of a permanent employee may be terminated by the Appointing Authority by giving a notice of three months, or on payment of emoluments for such period as the notice falls short of three months, or without notice on payment of three months' emoluments the post to which he/she is appointed is abolished.

CHAPTER-VI

19. Funds

The NADA shall have its own Bank account which all the receipts including the Grant-in-aid from the Government of India shall be deposited. The accounts shall be kept in any nationalized bank and a withdrawals therefrom shall be authorized by CEO till detailed delegation of powers with the approval of the competent authority is framed. Proper accounting of the receipts and payments along with necessary vouchers and registers shall be kept under the custody of Administrative-cum-Accounts Officer for production to audit or any other authority as may be prescribed. The ceiling limits for drawal of cheques may be regulated as per Governing Body decisions taken from time to time.

The same canons of financial propriety which govern expenditure from public funds will followed on matters of the expenditure from the NADA Fund. In brief the following principles shall followed:—

Every authority authorized to incur expenditure from the NADA Fund:

- 1. shall exercise the same amount of caution as a prudent man will do in respect of his of money;
- 2. shall ensure that the amount being expended has the approval of the competent authority
- 3. the expenditure is not more than what the occasion demands; and
- 4. expenditure related to purchases is incurred only after proper estimates have been preper and quotations have been obtained and approved by the competent authority.

The General Financial Rules of Government shall be fully applicable. The Administrative-cum-Accounts Officer shall be authorized to draw money from the bank on behalf of NADA.

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While the limitations contained in the Government Rules relating to purchases, incentives to employees etc., may be adopted in general, as the occasion may demand, the CEO can exercise his discretion in the choice of items on matters dealing with international events and on compensating the employees for meritorious work done. The ceiling limits prescribed for Government Servants or the limitation imposed by DFPR etc. shall not bind the CEO/DG in this regard.

CHAPTER-VII

20. Budget and Accounting

The Audited Accounts and Annual Reports shall be got prepared by the Administrative-cum-Accounts Officer and placed before the General Body and also before the Housés of Parliament every year through Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports after it is audited by Comptroller & Auditor General of India. The Society shall appoint an internal auditor for concurrent audit of accounts before it is subject to external batio audit. The pension funds and other similar funds shall be properly administered by a small trust formed within NADA and it may be ensured that adequate provisions in the budget are demanded and obtained to meet the expenditure on this account. The Administrative-cum-Accounts Officer shall also ensure that realistic budget estimates for Plan and Non-Plan expenditure are prepared with the approval of CEO on each occasion such as BE, RE, Supplementary Grant, Annual Plan, Performance Budgeting, Outcome Budget, Zero Base Budget etc.

F. No. 25-5/2008/ID.—In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 5 of the Bye-laws of the National Anti Doping Agency, the Governing Body of National Anti Doping Agency hereby notifies the following rules for regulating the methods of recruitment to the posts of (Scientific & Administrative Staff Group I to IV under the National Anti Doping Agency.

1. Short title and commencement.—(i) These rules may be called National Anti Doping Agene (Scientific & Administrative Staff) Recruitment Rules, 2008.

(ii) They shall be deemed to have come into force from 7-4-2008.

2. Application :— These rules shall apply to the posts specified in column 1 of the schedule annexe to these rules.

3. Number of posts, classification and scale of pay.—The number of posts, their classification as scale of pay attached thereto shall be as specified in columns 2 to 4 of the aforesaid schedule.

4. Initial Constitution.—(a) All the employees in NADA working on adhoc basis on any of the post mentioned in the schedule on the date these rules come into force shall, after the approval by a du constituted committee, be deemed to have been appointed under these rules with effect from date as may decided by the said committee in each individual case.

(b) All the employees working on a regular basis on any of the post contained in the schedule to the rules will be deemed to have been appointed under these rules with effect from the date of init appointment to the post subject further to the terms of the Bye-laws.

5. Method of recruitment, age-limit and other classification, etc.—The method of recruitment, age limit, qualifications and other matters connected therewith shall be as specified in columns 5 to 14 of these Schedule.

6. Disqualification :- No person,-

(a) who has entered into or contracted a marriage with a person having a spouse living, or

(b) who, having a spouse living, has entered into or contracted a marriage with any person, shall eligible for appointment to the said post :

Provided that the Governing Body may, if satisfied that such marriage is permissible under personal law applicable to such person and the other party to the marriage and that there are other grounds so doing, exempt any person from the operation of this rule.

7. Power to relax :—Where the Governing Body is of the opinion that it is necessary or expedie to do, it may by order, for reasons to be recorded in writing, relax any of the provisions of these rules respect to any class or category of persons.

8. Saving :—Nothing in these rules shall affect reservations, relaxation of age-limit and concessions required to be provided for the scheduled castes, the scheduled tribes, other backward cle the Ex-servicemen and other special categories of persons, in accordance with the orders issued b Central Government for time to time in this regard.


