

FIA ANTI-DOPING DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE

Mr Thomas SCHEIBELBERGER

Decision notified on 10.12.2012

Mr Thomas Scheibelberger, who took part in the Nyirad (HUN) event counting towards the 2012 FIA European Championship for Autocross Drivers and who was selected for a doping control on 18 August 2012, tested positive for Carboxy-THC (a metabolite of cannabis), which is a specified substance belonging to Section S.8 of the World Anti-Doping Agency Prohibited List.

The FIA Anti-Doping Disciplinary Committee (ADC) held a hearing on this case in Paris on 5 November 2012.

Decision of the ADC

The ADC concluded that an Anti-Doping Rule Violation according to Article 2.1 of the FIA Anti-Doping Regulations – "Presence of a Prohibited Substance or its Metabolites or Markers in a Driver's Sample" – was established.

As a consequence, the ADC has decided to impose the following sanctions on Mr Thomas Scheibelberger:

- Ineligibility for a period of six months, starting on 13 September 2012 and expiring on 13 March 2013;
- 2) Disqualification of the result obtained by the Athlete in the Nyirad (HUN) event of the 2012 FIA European Championship for Autocross Drivers, with all of the resulting consequences including forfeiture of any trophies, points and prizes.

Mr Thomas Scheibelberger has 21 days in which to appeal this decision to the Court of Arbitration for Sport.
