Decision of the Court of Arbitration for Sport

Reminder of the facts:

Mr Tomáš Enge tested positive for levmethamphetamine (a specified stimulant) and amphetamine (a nonspecified stimulant) belonging to Section S6, Stimulants, of the World Anti-Doping Agency Prohibited List, during the Navarra (ESP) event counting towards the FIA GT1 World Championship on 26 May 2012.

By a decision dated 20 July 2012, the FIA Anti-doping Disciplinary Committee disqualified Mr Tomáš Enge from the individual result achieved in the Navarra (ESP) event of the 2012 FIA GT1 World Championship, as well as from any competitive results achieved as from 14 June 2012, and suspended him for 18 (eighteen) months, starting on 14 June 2012 and expiring on 14 December 2013.

Mr Tomáš Enge decided to appeal this decision to the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS), based in Lausanne, Switzerland. The hearing before the Panel of the CAS took place on 4 March 2013.

CAS Decision:

By a decision dated 15 April 2013, the Panel of the CAS decided to reject Mr Tomáš Enge's appeal against the decision of the FIA Anti-doping Disciplinary Committee suspending him for 18 months.

The CAS considered in particular:

- that the sanction pronounced by the FIA Anti-doping Disciplinary Committee was just and fair,

- and that the decision of that Committee was justified and based on a careful examination of the evidence submitted.

Also, the CAS sentenced Mr Tomáš Enge to pay all the costs of the procedure before the CAS and to pay the FIA the sum of 5,000 CHF as a contribution towards the costs borne by the FIA.
