## **IRISH SPORT ANTI-DOPING DISCIPLINARY PANEL**

## IN THE MATTER OF IS-1522 , ATHLETE

## DETERMINATION

- 1. The Irish Sports Council notified Mr. IS-1522 on the 31<sup>st</sup> August,2010, of an alleged first violation by him of Article 2.1 of the Irish Anti-Doping Rules.
- 2. The Football Association of Ireland, being the national governing body of his sport, were also notified.
- 3. By letter to the Irish Sport Anti-Doping Disciplinary Panel, dated the 14th September, 2010, the athlete admitted the allegation.
- 4. The Panel, comprising the undersigned, as chair, Mr. Sean McCague and Mr. Martin Walsh, convened on the 13<sup>th</sup> December, 2010, to hear and determine the consequences of the admitted violation of the Irish Anti-Doping Rules.
- 5. The Athlete testified at the hearing. He confirmed that he had consumed cannabis in a social context on different occasions in advance of, but unconnected with, his sporting activities. He also admitted that he had used cannabis since the date of his testing.
- 6. The Athlete stated that he did not expect to be subject to testing for drugs.
- 7. The Athlete expressed his regret and remorse for his violation of the Irish Anti-Doping Rules and submitted that his consumption of the prohibited drug was not intended to enhance his sport performance.
- 8. The Athlete stated that it was not his intention to use cannabis in the future.
- 9. Having heard and considered the testimony and submissions made by the Athlete, the Panel;
  - a. noted that the Athlete had admitted at an early date that he had, by consuming cannabis, violated the Irish Anti-Doping Rules;
  - b. noted that the Athlete had knowingly violated the Irish Anti-Doping Rules;
  - c. Noted that the athlete had admitted using cannabis after the date of his testing for this case;
  - d. accepted that the use of cannabis by the Athlete was not intended to enhance his sport performance;
  - e. accepted that the Athlete's expression of regret and remorse was genuine; and
  - f. accepted that special circumstances, within the meaning of Article 10.3 of the Irish Anti-Doping Rules, had been established and corroborated to the comfortable satisfaction of the Panel;

10. The Panel determined that, having regard to and for the reasons set out above, the Athlete be suspended for a period of six months with effect from the 1<sup>st</sup> March, 2011.
