NADA notified its assertion relating to violation of Anti Doping Rule 2.1 by Dhamodharan Gajapathi (Sports discipline – Weightlifting) Hearing was conducted on 19.05.2010, 30-06-2010 & 14-07-2010 by the hearing panel constituted under rule 8.3.2.

Dr. Pradeep H. Gupta, Sr. P. O., NADA presented the case on behalf of NADA and produced the documents in support of the case.

It has been pointed out that the weightlifter was first found positive in dope test conducted during Sr. National Weightlifting Championship held at Visakhapatnam from 10-14 Dec. 2006. Again sample of urine was collected from the weightlifter on 06.11.2009 during 53rd Inter Services Weightlifting Championship held at Jamnagar, Gujrat and again gave adverse analytical findings for Anabolic Steroids.

Despite service on the athlete by Registered AD post, he has not chosen to appear before the Hearing Panel.

It is each athlete personal duty to ensure that no prohibited substance enters his body (Article 2.1.1) Athletes are responsible for any Prohibited Substance or its Metabolites or Markers found to be present in their bodily specimens. It is not necessary that intent, fault, negligence on knowing use on the Athletes part be demonstrated in order to establish an Anti Doping Rule Violation, under Article 2.1 Steroid is not a specified substance under Article 10.3 of the NADA rules. Hence Steroid is not susceptible to unintentional anti-doping rule violations because of its general availability in medicinal products or which are less likely to be successfully abused as anti-doping agents.

The Athlete failed to establish any grounds for elimination or reduction of period of ineligibility under Article 10.5.1 or Article 10.5.2.

NADA has placed on record letter from the General Secretary, Indian Weightlifting Federation (File No. IWF-11/18/2010-11/Vol (v)/GD dt. May 25, 2010) along with the communication to Services Sports Control Board dated March 09, 2007 to prove the earlier sanctions imposed under clause 2.1 of the WADA Code .

The period of ineligibility under Article 10.7 for the second anti doping rule violation of Article 2.1 is Eight (8) years to a life ban. Normally the period of ineligibility starts on the date of the hearing decision. There are no special circumstances in this case to warrant any consideration for the early start of the period of ineligibility.

Under Article 10.7 ineligibility of Eight(8) years is imposed on the Athlete Mr. Dhamodharan Gajapathi, No.-573/2, 14th Street, ICF South Colony, Chennai- 38, Tamilnadu for the violation of Article 2.1 of Anti Doping Rules, NADA second time. The period of ineligibility shall commence from the date of this decision.
