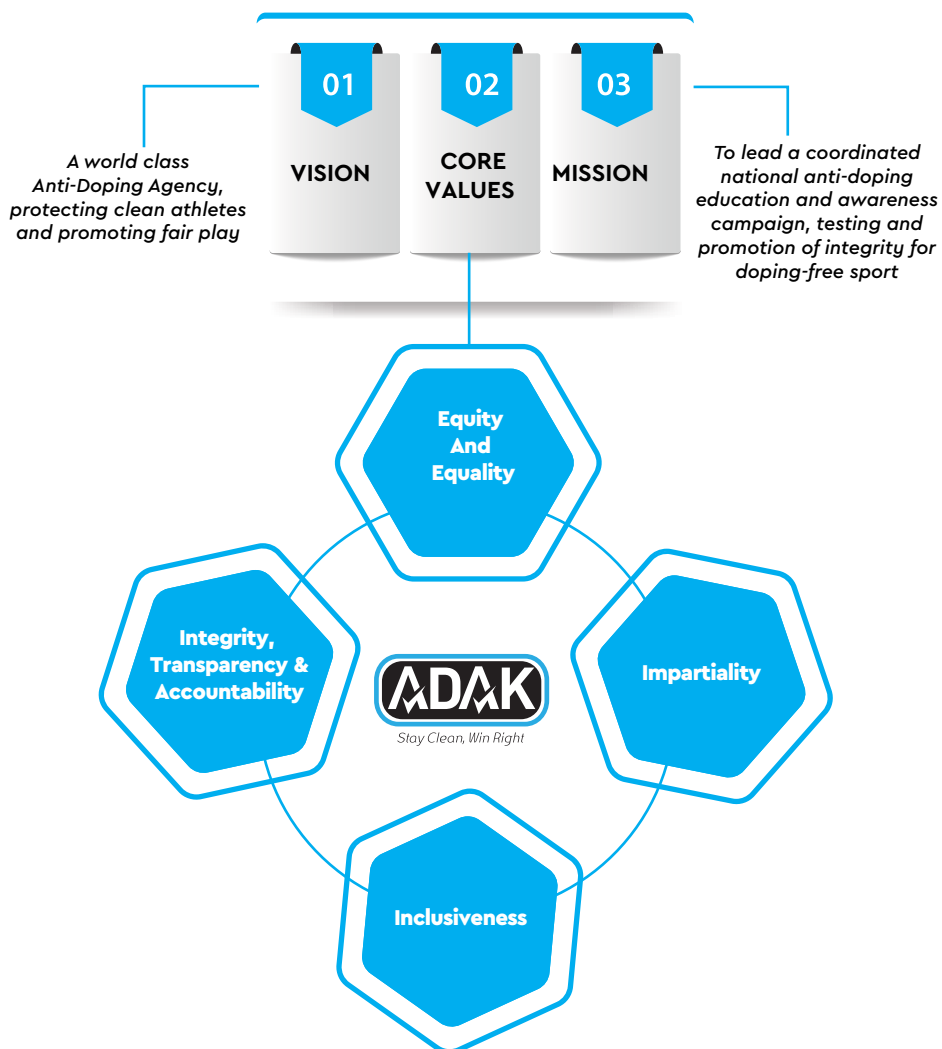

WHO WE ARE

The Anti-Doping Agency of Kenya (ADAK) is a body corporate established under the Anti-Doping Act, 2016. The Agency is the only organization permitted to carry out Anti-Doping activities in Kenya and its authority shall be recognized by all national federations



ADAK BACKGROUND

Kenya is a signatory to the 2005 UNESCO Convention against Doping in Sports. Article 5 of the Convention states that, "In abiding by the obligations contained in this convention, each State Party undertakes to adopt appropriate measures. Such measures may include legislation, regulation, policies or administrative practices".

In addition to the above, Article 22 of the World Anti-Doping Code 2015 further specifies that each Government will put in place measures to enhance cooperation and sharing of information and data with Anti-Doping Organizations as provided in the Code. It is against this background that the Government of Kenya established the Anti-Doping Agency of Kenya (ADAK) vide Anti-Doping Act No. 5 Of 2016 as a State Corporation.

In 2011, the Ministry of Sports together with the National Olympic Committee of Kenya (NOCK) formed what was called the Kenya Anti-Doping Agency (KADA). The establishment of KADA enabled Team Kenya to participate in the 2012 London Olympics. However, KADA lacked legal backing hence it was not sustainable. As a short-term measure, His Excellency the President established the Anti-Doping Agency of Kenya (ADAK) through an Executive

Order of November 2015.

The Executive Order was followed by a Legal Notice No.256 of 24th December 2015. Even then all those measures did not meet World Anti- Doping Agency (WADA) requirement of establishing a National Anti-Doping Organization (NADO). Thus the Anti- Doping Agency of Kenya (ADAK) was legally established through an Act of Parliament after the enactment of the Anti-Doping Bill to an Anti- Doping Act, No.5 on 22nd April 2016.

Since its establishment ADAK has reached out to over 80,851 Kenyans through sensitization and awareness campaigns that were conducted during various activities. In addition, over 4,200 doping tests have been carried out among athletes from various sports disciplines and levels. The Agency has also trained adequate numbers of ----- Anti-Doping Educators, ---- Doping Control Officers and---- Chaperones and ----- Phlebotomists who work on volunteer basis.

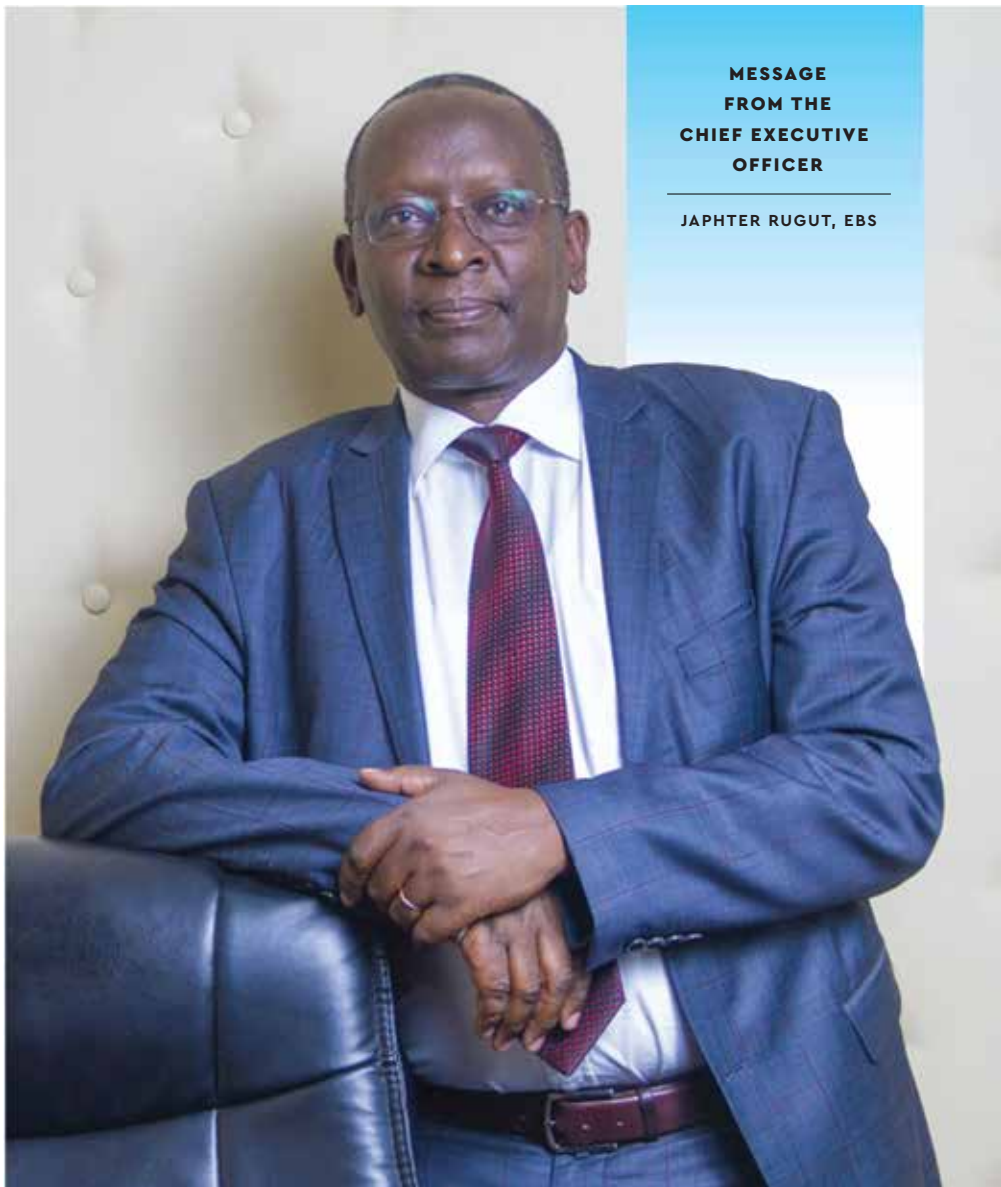

MESSAGE FROM THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

ADAK is now marking close to five years since establishment in the year 2016 through the Anti-Doping Act of 2016. Our resolve is and will always be and remain that we seek to stay competitive and innovative in a fast-changing world of sport and to prepare our champions by investing in their skills, in their ability to adapt to change, and in their ability to innovate without having to resort to cheating and dishonesty.

The Agency continues to benefit a lot from goodwill from Kenya's political leadership, the Kenyan public at large, as well as, guidance and support from international partnerships. The World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA), Anti-Doping Norway (ADNO), United Kingdom Anti-Doping (UKAD), South African Institute for Drug- free Sports (SAIDS) and the Regional Anti-Doping Organization (RADO, Africa Zone V) have been on hand all along the way with support on best practices, capacity building and other related backing.

Internally, we continue to work with other government agencies and bodies whose processes impact directly and indirectly on the operational mandate

of ADAK. These include, but are not limited to, the Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI) of the Kenya Police Service; particularly the Anti-Narcotics section, The Department of Immigration, The Kenya Medical Practitioners and Dentists Board (KMPDB), Kenya Pharmacy and Poisons Board (KPPB) and the National Registration Bureau among others. Operational documents and protocol have been, and continue to be, developed to protect information and materials shared with these bodies.

A busy year it has been whose highlights include the Athlete Annual Conference that was organized by the Athletics Integrity Unit (AIU) together with Athletics Kenya (AK) in December last year and the progressive partnership meeting between the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA), Anti-Doping Norway (ADNO) and Anti-Doping Agency of Kenya (ADAK) that seeks to enhance ADAK's competencies in doping control. In all these, ADAK gave a good account of itself, even as it continues to enhance its capacity through competitive recruitment of Staff and training of the personnel to achieve the required level of competence.

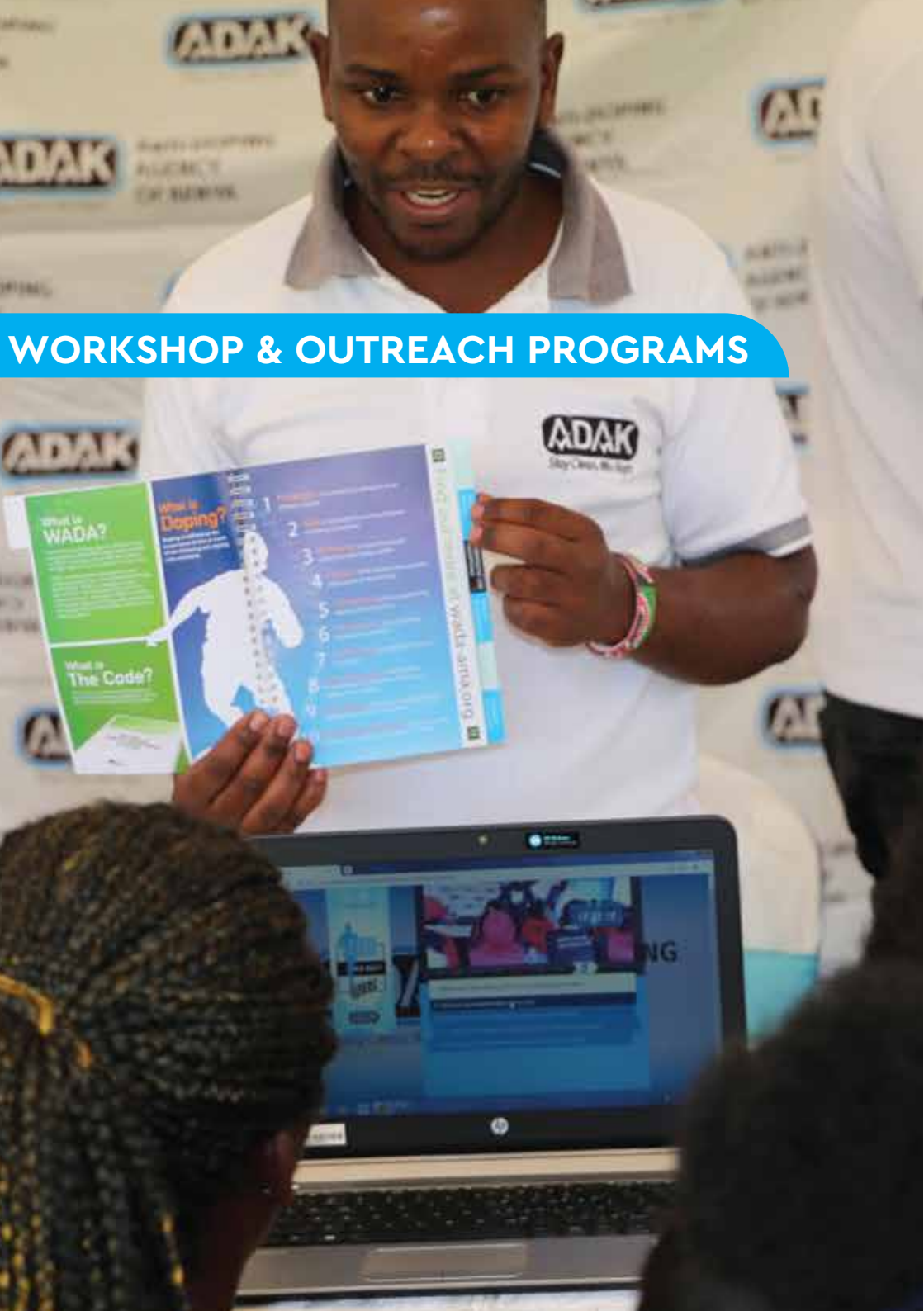
